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## **Bente Polano**

## Danish Artist & Sculptor, based in Elsinore, Denmark

Visiting Bente in her studio by the sea in Elsinore is like entering a different world. One where you are lifted high above the trivialities of everyday life. Intense beauty meets your eye from everywhere you look - the walls, the floor, the windows with the stunning views. Paintings, sculptures, drawings, prints ... everything Bente produces leaves you breathless.

Bente Polano takes her inspiration from nature, her immediate surroundings, especially the sea and the forest, and from myths and stories. The human being is central in her work, whether entrenched in nature or by itself, naked, confronting existential questions about identity and self. Her paintings are illuminous, full of life and vibrancy, their many layers and careful craftmanship transmitting pure light. Bente's sculptures, made of stainless steel or bronze, are cut out in one session, giving them a solid robustness as well as a stoic elegance. They too play with questions about the self, reaching inwards and outwards simultaniously, inviting the viewer to be part of their existence.

The recently completed Hamlet Sculpture, made of stainless steel, reflects the viewer's own image like a mirror reflection. In this way, sculpture and viewer become one, their stories and inner complexities melt together and become part of the same fabric.
